OVERVIEW

This study will investigate the look and feel of three designs/flows through testing of student attitudes and preferences. Elements of these designs/flows will be incorporated into the final look and feel design for the LC unit.

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

- 2. What aspects of designs feel most age-appropriate? Lend to focus? Easy to understand?


